# Autism in Practice: Implementing the Menu of Interventions in Your Local Authority

Thursday 31st July, 10am-3pm at Number 6, 24 Hill Street

The *Menu of Interventions* was drawn up by a multi-agency group including parents and carers and aims to provide a guide to interventions and supports required by people on the autism spectrum. The Menu highlights some of the challenges faced by people on the autism spectrum, across the lifespan and ability range, and identifies what an individual might need to support such challenges.

**Autism Network Scotland** is hosting a range of Autism in Practice events across the country, which aim to support communities to implement the Menu of Interventions and to make the document meaningful and useful. They are inviting local practitioners, people on the spectrum and their family and carers to our event: Autism in Practice – Implementing the Menu of Interventions in your Local Authority. This will be an opportunity to:

- find out about key information gathered at the central event
- share examples of good practice
- find out what is happening in your area
- meet other practitioners and families
- learn how to use the Menu itself.

You will be supporting the Menu by bringing your own knowledge and experience, generating new ideas alongside peers, identifying local priorities and potential areas for research. Information gathered will be posted on the Autism Network Website for easy access and sharing information across the whole of Scotland.

Cost: Free to people living and/or working with people on the Autism Spectrum.

This month, Amy Pickles, Participation Co-ordinator from Autism Initiatives, will speak to the group about Autism Life in Colour 2014.


**Please note** that this month's meeting will take place at the above address. There is a car park, and the venue is served by Lothian buses 3, 7, 29 and 33.

## Profile Tool Pilot—Participants Needed

We would like to invite you to take part in a pilot of the Independent Living Skills Profile Tool developed by ourselves and Scottish Autism. The profile tool is a document in which carers can record, from their perspective, their family member's present independent living skills and the challenges they experience in various different areas of life.

The completed document provides a bank of information for carers to use to inform others. It could potentially be used by support services to develop support plans, to support social work referrals, or to support benefits assessments or applications. It could also be used in emergency planning.

A member of staff would support you to fill in the Profile Tool, which could be done in several sessions. Anyone who is involved in the pilot will be able to keep the finished document to use however they choose. They will also be asked to evaluate the document to inform any future development of the profile tool.
